Conversion from UAS to Bachelor's degrees

Information regarding titles after 1 January 2009

Information sheet for holders of a UAS degree obtained prior to introduction of the Bachelor-Master system

The UAS titles issued to graduates prior to introduction of the new Bachelor-Master system shall remain legally protected. Starting from 1 January 2009 (when the first Bachelor's degrees were issued) holders of UAS degrees issued under previous legislation may also use the titles Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BSc). There will be no change in title (subsequent issuance of a Bachelor's degree). Anyone who uses a legally protected UAS title without having met the corresponding requirements may be subject to prosecution.

The structure of the legally protected title is uniform and must include at the very minimum the degree title (Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science) and the name or abbreviation of the UAS that issued the degree. As an option, this legally protected title may also include mention of the branch of studies and a specialisation.
